Estimated attendance is 4,000. An art show and dealer's exhibit room are also part of the event. Announcement of the Hugo Awards happens at the banquet.</p>

The museum building, based in exterior design on standard station construction of the 1880s, houses the largest known collection of historic records, mementos, artifacts, and pictures of Colorado railroads. The museum grounds, 15 acres, contain three main buildings: the actual museum and gift shop, the Robert W. Richardson Library, and the Cornelius W. Hauck Restoration Facility, better known as the Roundhouse.</p>
